River Forest Resident Elected First Vice President of Illinois Bar Foundation

CHICAGO, IL, July 24, 2015 – Elizabeth A. Kaveny, of River Forest, a partner with the Chicago law firm of Burke Wise Morrissey & Kaveny, has been elected as first vice president of the Illinois Bar Foundation (IBF), the charitable arm of the Illinois State Bar Association (ISBA).

The foundation raises funds for distribution to Illinois nonprofit organizations whose mission is to provide free legal services to those with limited means.
